LEAVING THE CHURCH, LOITERING WITH GOD

I know it may have been a long time since you hosted a party or invited a small group over, but I wonder whether you have had to use one of the above tactics (or similar) to get people to leave? This tactic may seem harsh or unfriendly but sometimes 'needs must.'

Not too long ago I had to adopt the tactic of turning down the background music that we use during private prayers in Church when it was clear that those who turned up, showed no sign of leaving after the hour was up. It was wonderful, though, to see that folks were so keen to "loiter in God's presence...", a phrase used by a previous Archdeacon reflecting on Anna.

'And then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped night and day, fasting and praying.' (Luke 2:37).

Thankfully God's presence is not confined to a building so leaving after a service or meeting, hardly means separation from God's abiding presence, where we can always loiter without leaving. [ILM]
