

CHURCH FOR ALL WITH UNRESTRICTED ACCESS

To say all are welcome and at the same time, say (or put up signs) that all are restricted, seems to be giving a double message, especially when the restricted areas, squash the unrestricted areas into a tiny space.

Living with restrictions is uncomfortable to say the least and requires adjustments on so many levels. It is not surprising therefore that when restrictions are lifted, we remind ourselves of what we've missed and perhaps wonder how we coped for so long.

In our midday prayers in Church this week, we were reminded of Jesus' welcome and his attitude to unrestricted access.

"Jesus said, let the little children come to me and do not stop them for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs. And he laid his hands on them and went on his way. (Matthew 19: 14-15).

It seems to me that welcome and access are possibly two sides of the same coin and that in Jesus we have unrestricted access as children or as children of God [ILM].

plastic bag, and burying it, then lighting a fire over it will keep it safe."

This is an extract from the attached Hidden Church booklet which takes you through various countries and testimonies to give us snapshot of what it is like not to be able to practise our faith openly. Behind the stories, there is also a message of hope, as despite the adversities we read about those who faith strives even in secret.

Lord we pray for those who live their faith in secret, in fear of retaliation. We pray for your protection over them, may they draw strength in knowing the depth of Christ's love for them and may you help us to pray for them and know how best to help them.

Grant the leaders wisdom and compassion, that they may find a path that will enable a rapid de escalation of violence and set them on a long lasting peace process. May you help the international community to play the role that will help the process.
