

ST BARNABAS 125TH ANNIVERSARY (1898-2023)



The 125 celebrations started on St Barnabas Day with an appeal to support GoMAD Tanzania [Go Make a Difference in Tanzania] with their goal of planting 25,0000 trees in the Masoma region of Tanzania. Last Sunday we welcomed Graham McClure, who founded GoMAD and Claire Anderson, their in-country manager, based in Tanzania to update us on the project we are

You can catch up with the service via our Youtube channel. Altogether, our donations were enough to buy more than 800 trees which will be planted by the Anglican church in Buhemba. The 'Plant a Tree' Save a Life' project aims to create a sustainable tree planting and harvesting scheme in a country where trees are often last resort option to source emergency money, which has led to deforestation. The scheme helps farmers grow out of poverty by providing fast growing trees which, after a period of 10 years growth, can be harvested responsibly and provide money for health and education. Farmers are also trained and taught how to prune the trees so that they can grow taller. THE #125 FUND

The 125th celebrations ended on 15th October with Bishop Martin in attendance and a Gift Day for the 125 Fund. The aim of the 125 Fund is to raise £125,000 to fund 3 projects to make St Barnabas' fit for the future. The first project is a lighting project which will involve a rewiring and relighting design. The project will draw on the latest technology to make our church brighter and more welcoming, draw out its beautiful architecture and be energy efficient. The second project is to install solar panels on the roof, which will provide us with a sustainable energy footprint as well as reducing our energy costs. The last and third project will be the refurbishment of our toilets which, given their heavy use and signs of wear, will be very welcomed by many of our regular users.





We set up the 125 fund at the start of the year with legacy monies and one-off gifts from the late Uncle Richards, Myrtle Paynter and Margaret Rose Goodfellow which, together, totalled nearly one thousand pounds. We felt that allocating these monies to the 125 fund would be a lovely way to remember them by.

The aim of the fund is to raise a £125,000 not only from donations and legacies, but also from grants and reserves. We are delighted to share that the donations since then have now raised more than ten thousand pounds, which brings the total raised through donations and legacies to more than £11,500. 
